NRC

NRC met for an Emergency NRC Meeting last week regarding Victorina's payment Plan.

Given WA and NSW branches requesting amendments to our proposed payment plan paper I did not believe it was fair for other branches to be weighing in and commenting on our current Financial shortfalls, therefore I withdrew the paper.

Currently we are still un-Financial and probably won't be for some time. I believe the Victorian Rover Council is happy with being unfinancial for the time being as it gives us breathing space to gather some income and for my Regions to truly look over how we can make \$11k to national better value to membership. The Region chairs met with the NRC chair on Monday night, I will add some cometary in the minutes.

Vaccinations

The public health directions are clear about the requirements for individual workers (including volunteers) and organisations including Scouts Victoria. We are dealing with a legislated requirement here and the fines associated with the failure to comply with these directions can be between \$10-20k for individuals and \$100k for organisations and we don't wish to subject anyone to these sorts of infringements.

If you have not completed your e-form we must treat you as being unvaccinated and you will not be able to participate face-to-face Scouting.

Vaccinations are not being considered a mandatory requirement for membership of Scouts Victoria; it is only



being required for those that want to participate face-to face over the coming months.






Pathways, Badges and Terrain











Region Rankings



7.1 **MPAC** Report



The MPAC Project Patrol have been hard at work this month reviewing the previous MPAC design and discussing the aspects most important to be included in the main hall. The preferred supplier of the bunkhouses has informed us that they have the ability to provide what MPAC requires but is not able to begin construction until late 2022/early 2023. This is slightly later than our initial planned commencement date of mid-2022 but will allow for more time to finalise approvals and engage a contractor for the construction of the main hall. The Project Patrol is currently on-track to completing the design of MPAC in mid-December. The tasks following comprise gaining planning permissions and tender writing.
