- Some questions/feedback regarding this potential workshop have been raised and will be addressed here:

QUESTIONS REGARDING MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

1. Needs to be youth led. Our crew is in a strange situation as it is so remote from other crews and the Venturer Units are all distanced and small. Need to see full proposal at Region to be voted on.
2. How would this directly affect my crew? Would we need to change our current program to accommodate these things?
3. One of the most major factors for membership atm is financials, which with raising costs even I will be leaving by next census.
4. If there is a hand book/tools/resources to effectively implement this program
5. To be honest, the above question confused us.

ANSWERS:

1. This would be a completely youth led program, designed to be run at a unit level for others (e.g. as a joint night with Venturers, a Rover night, or in the community to promote Scouting). This would be proposed to all Regions for a go ahead when the finer details are straightened. I would be writing up the template and potentially running a prototype within my own Unit to test it.
2. This would not affect your current program, this would be a bit of a workshop, which can be adjusted to suit the needs of each unit (e.g. you can shift the focus onto gaining venturers, educating new Rovers, etc)
3. Financials is a discussion that would likely need to be discussed in your unit to see if a solution can be found.
4. A template will be designed and tested by all units who said in the survey they would like to test this out. Whilst the results would need to be seen long term, feedback from all participants involved will help with refining this program.
5. The idea being proposed is to introduce a workshop designed to help Units with understanding how Rovers works, especially for linking/older Venturers and new Rovers, and hopefully to improve membership retention as a result.

- I am in the process of designing an example program for how this would look like and I am willing to test it with my own Unit, as well as the Units who have stated that they also wish to participate.

- The benefits to this would include better inter-sectional bonds (especially between Venturers & Rovers), better membership retention (through activities designed to get to know one another better & work together), and an understanding of how Rovers works (each Unit would provide information about themselves, how they function, etc)

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Much has been written about the extraordinary life of Queen Elizabeth since her death. It is not unfair to say that Her Majesty touched the lives of many in her country, the Commonwealth, and the wider world. Scouts Australia is deeply saddened at the news of her passing.

As the Royal Patron of Scouts Australia, the Queen showed an active interest in our Movement. Many of us have achieved the Queen's Scout Award and proudly wear the badge on our uniform.

The Queen dedicated her life to service for her country, and the broader Commonwealth. Interestingly, "Service" was, until recently, the motto of the Rover Section). Her dedication to service is exemplified in the famous words of John F. Kennedy in his inaugural speech – "Ask not what your country can do for you – ask what you can do for your country".

Scout Promise

There are two versions of the Scout Promise. One remains unchanged but, following the Queen's death and the ascension of King Charles III, the traditional version is now altered to reflect this change:

*On my honour
I promise that I will do my best
To do my duty to my God, and
To the **King** of Australia
To help other people,
And to live by the Scout Law*

Rover Centre

Where do I start! What an amazing few weeks! First, we had a water leak, discovered by our MARB Chair at the Committee meeting. The main hall, passageway and toilets were soaked. Initially, the problem was thought to be a leaking roof but subsequent investigation revealed it was a blocked sewer.

As a consequence, the roof has been checked (and is OK), the gutters cleaned and debris in the inlet to the water tank

removed. The blocked sewer has also been cleared. The carpets have been vacuumed to remove excess water and the heaters turned on to assist with drying. As of Sunday, whilst the carpet tiles were dry on top, there was still water underneath. This may mean that the tiles have to be removed and replaced. I have contacted Branch to ascertain the next moves, but at the time of writing this report (Monday) I am still awaiting confirmation of how we move forward.

The attempts to dry the carpet caused the second problem, a loss of some electrical capacity. We have found that both aircon units cannot operate at the same time for any extended period. It has now been necessary to replace a junction box where the power enters the building, upgrade the power supply to three phase (because the building is listed as commercial this is currently the best option) and, because of its age, but more importantly to ensure the safety of all users of the Centre, the switchboard will be upgraded to meet current standards. Further, the meter will be relocated outside the building for easy access by the power supplier and retailer. This work is yet to be completed.

Just to add to the excitement, our neighbours reported to the Police that the main door to the shed was open. On inspection, it appeared to be a forced entry. Just to confirm this to be the case, RSM members were contacted to ascertain if they had used the shed prior to the weekend's event at Mafeking. It was confirmed that RSM members had not been on site. Although some items had been disturbed, on an initial inspection, it appears that nothing is missing. This will be confirmed when other parties who store items in the shed (CAS Terras) have checked their supplies.

I thanked the neighbours personally on Sunday night and have given them a small gift and a letter of thanks (attached) as well.

Whilst there have been a few people involved, I must pay particular thanks to Drew who has been to the Centre countless times over the past few weeks to check on various aspects of the problems. Given my geographical location, I have appreciated Drew's help.

Michael (Jeff) has also helped with arranging access to the Centre for the plumber and electrician. Thank you.

Given all of the above, the Rover Centre will remain closed for the foreseeable future.

Introduction

Mudbash is an event operated by the Rover Section of The Scout Association of Australia, Victorian Branch. Rovers are 18-26 years of age. The Mudbash Committee as the organizing body, runs the event and is made up primarily of Rovers. There are several Advisors and Commissioners assisting the Committee with running the event.

The weekend entails low speed motorsport events run under the Confederation of Australian Motorsport. Each "Rover Unit" enters a vehicle to compete in and each crew member is a driver, passenger or both for events. The Rover Units camp on site for the weekend.

Expectations of up to 700 people will camp on site for the weekend, although over recent years this number has been around the 600-800 mark. The Sunday of the event weekend is "Open Day", which is designed for members of the public and other scouts to be on site.

The property is 319 acres in size and is in Caveat. The site is a rural/recreational property with several buildings, open grass areas and thick scrub in areas.

Budget Breakdown

Income

Mudbash ticket price is set at \$75 presold (inclusive of square processing fee) and \$95 at the gate. Service tickets are included at the reduced cost of \$30, this acknowledges the committee's voluntary nature and provides incentive to participate. Or 'work' for your dinner.

Sponsorship income has remained in the budget, This is more of a bonus rather than a necessity, why it has remained in the budget.

Driver fees are as per previous years, continuing the existing strategy of late fees to promote a more organised event and gaining early commitment from Rover units.

Expenditure

Mudbash is going to pump some more into our beloved activities and entertainment teams to get some more activities running for those who aren't driving and also to get some more bands and variety of entertainment. After the previous event The works team have also gotten a bump to allow for inflation and an additional pump out mid event. We have cut Power and Comm's PA and Radios down due to RSM getting some of their own equipment for next year.

Closing Statement

With last year's event feedback from the participants, we are trying to better the event for those who aren't spending the whole time racing during the day. I like to think our budget reflects this well as we

try to grow and use the money our participants contribute to add to the event. Our capital works are planned and getting ran past the Mafeking committee, We are also adding into our works budget to hopefully keep the facilities in better condition through out the event.
