As announced in Be Informed yesterday, due to a delay in securing a suitable date with Government House, the presentation of Queen's Scouts and Baden-Powell Awards will now occur early in 2020. The usual deadline for nominations of August 31 has been extended to November 30, 2019. When available, details of the confirmed date will be advised in Be Informed. Please ensure that this information is passed down through Regions.

The next Rover Advisor conference is coming up on Saturday the 14th of September from 9am to 4pm – if your Crew, Region or Subcommittee RA has not yet attended a conference, please encourage them to go along – registrations close on the 7th of September.

At the most recent NRC remote meeting, on the 7th of August, the future of Rover shoulder badges (epaulettes), knots and service bars were discussed. NSW amended their original paper (which included a sunset clause for the eventual discontinuation of all three) to bring it in line with the paper submitted by Victoria and the ACT, which proposes that the shoulder badges be presented upon completion of Rover Basic Training, and that knots and service bars be presented upon investiture as a Rover Scout. Consensus was that any final decision on the future of these items was best left until the NRC Conference in February 2020. In the meantime, Crews are free to continue issuing the epaulettes, knots and service bars however they choose.



Rover Advisors need to be registered as soon as you bring them in to your crew or subcommittee. If you are having problems or don't know how to register your RA talk to your Region Commissioner or ASC and they will help you get the paperwork sorted. Rover Advisors like every other leader in Scouting need to be trained so they need to do a basic course qualification within the first twelve months of being an RA and advanced within three years – they need to know this is a minimum requirement when you hire them as your RA.


