I have been working on a template for the workshop I've been working on over the past couple of months. I will be presenting this to the Venturers at VVC for their feedback, and I have had feedback from a regional Rover Unit - that it may be beneficial to provide nearby Rover units with their local Venturer unit locations so they know where they can recruit members from. I will raise this with VVC in order to see if making a Unit map (similar to the one that Rovers made for Venturers) would be beneficial and feasible. I am looking to attend VG potentially to promote Rovers, possibly with the Rover stand.

A concern that has been raised to me from a couple of Units is that their units are refusing/unwilling to move to the current program and this is causing dissent within units, making a workshop such as the one I am working on important to make sure Rovers are not being left behind. This is important to address as new rovers will be required to complete the current program if they wish to complete their BPSA, and if their units are not facilitating/supporting this then many rovers will likely leave or look for a new unit - again a big struggle in regional Victoria as the units are more spread out. I am happy to work on a booklet/resource that units can utilise/provide to their members to ensure understanding about the current program. I strongly recommend rovers, older and younger, to complete their Scouting Essentials course, even if not going for their BP, in order to learn enough about the current program to support their unit.

National Rover Council Election of Chair

Following changes at the recent NRC Remote meeting, the Chair is elected at the last Remote meeting of the year, allowing them to shadow the current Chair.; all other NRC Team roles will be elected at the 2023 NRC Conference. NRC Team position descriptions are outlined in the NRC By-Laws, though we have also created a PDF of the latest position description for the NRC Chair that is available on our website: https://rovers.scouts.com.au/rovering/nrc-elections-2023/

Only the Returning Officer will have a copy of the file; it will be played for the purpose of the election, and then deleted. More information is in the Nomination Form.

Introduction

Mudbash is an event operated by the Rover Section of The Scout Association of Australia, Victorian Branch. Rovers are 18-26 years of age. The Mudbash Committee as the organizing body, runs the event and is made up primarily of Rovers. There are several Advisors and Commissioners assisting the Committee with running the event.

The weekend entails low speed motorsport events run under the Confederation of Australian Motorsport. Each "Rover Unit" enters a vehicle to compete in and each crew member is a driver, passenger or both for events. The Rover Units camp on site for the weekend.

Expectations of up to 700 people will camp on site for the weekend, although over recent years this number has been around the 600-800 mark. The Sunday of the event weekend is "Open Day", which is designed for members of the public and other scouts to be on site.

The property is 319 acres in size and is in Caveat. The site is a rural/recreational property with several buildings, open grass areas and thick scrub in areas.

We are planning to conduct Capital works around the Main arena to install additional permanent Speakers around the arena, The works will involve trenching and installing underground services to the main arena. These costs are listed in the budget.

Budget Breakdown

Income

Mudbash ticket price has now been set at \$70 presold (inclusive of square processing fee) and remaining \$95 at the gate. We have decided to keep the tickets at \$70, the same as last event, because of the inflation that has drastically effect everything this finical year. As much as we would love to lower the fees with the new rover levy coming in it does not seem feasible with the current finance climate. Service tickets are included at the reduced cost of \$30, this acknowledges the committee's voluntary nature and provides incentive to participate. Or 'work' for your dinner.

Sponsorship income has remained in the budget, this is more of a bonus rather than a necessity, why it has remained in the budget.

Driver fees are as per previous years, continuing the existing strategy of late fees to promote a more organised event and gaining early commitment from Rover units.

Expenditure

While allowing for general inflation, Mudbash is going to pump some more into our beloved activities and entertainment teams to get some more activities assets along with additional attractions. We are also have capital works planned to improve the infrastructure around the main arena.

We are expecting an increase in administration cost due to the acquisition of more participant wristbands and have lowered the admin supplies to be a more realistic estimation given the actuals from the previous event.

The Entertainment budget had a marginal increase due to general inflation and the additional performers.

The Treasurer's budget has remained the same as previous year's budget and any reserve funds will get delegated out as required.

Activities received an increase due to received feedback from participants requesting more activities to be held for those who are not driving. This increase will go toward the acquisition of new assets.

Works and Services have overall received a marginal increase from previous budgeted cost. However, note the previous events actuals reflect a last-minute hire fee from the toilet supplier. Additionally, we have Allowed for a Pump out for mid-way through the event as we have found this was a necessity from the previous event.

Events budget has had to allow the cost of hire for Rally clocks as they were required last event.

Power and Comms has lowered cost due to the RSM team no longer needing Radio equipment supplied.

P&R and Marketing has lowered due to majority of the marketing materials being acquired in the past few events.

Misc Spending reflects the capital works planned to take place in the coming months prior to the event, these works will consist of additional lighting and power around the main arena. Along with this we have allowed for a small increase in fuel cost. This is because the generator was oversized in previous years.

Closing Statement

With last year's event feedback from the participants, we are trying to better the event for those who aren't spending the duration of the event racing during the day. I like to think our budget reflects this well as we try to grow and use the money our participants contribute to add to the event. Our capital works are planned and getting ran past the Mafeking committee, we are also adding into our works budget to hopefully keep the facilities in better condition throughout the event. We believe this proposed budget adequately reflects the concerns raise from last month's VRC meeting regarding the Rover Levey as the ticket price has lowered from the inflated price to remain the same as the previous year's cost. We believe the savings from the inflation along with the additional attractions is acceptable to be exempt from the rover levy due to the acquisition of additional assets and capital works.

Honorary Treasurer's Report for the year ended 30 June 2022

The financial statements of the Consolidated Victorian Rover Council consist of The Victorian Rover Council; our three properties - Bogong Rover Chalet, WF Waters Lodge and Mafeking Rover Park; and five event and activity sub committees.

The Consolidated Victorian Rover Council has reported a turnover of \$406,399 for the year ended 30 June 2022 (2021 \$160,342), and a net surplus of \$8,480 (2021 deficit of \$69,772). Turnover is well up for the year as we returned to more normal operations, except for the results of Bogong Rover Chalet.

All activities including the VRC reported a surplus for the year, with exception being the Bogong Rover Chalet which has reported a deficit of \$44k. This deficit is due to overhead and winter party 2021 expenses incurred for a season cut short by Covid. The aggregate surplus of \$8.5k is net of \$31k of depreciation and includes \$41k in insurance charges paid to Scouts Victoria.

As of 30 June 2022, net assets are \$1,206,786, whilst cash assets equate to \$634,041 (2021: \$680,851). The majority of cash balance sits with our three properties; however, VRC also retains historical reserves. Cash as expected, reduced as we refunded winter bookings from 2021 winter season, and have incurred ongoing operating costs and capital outlays in our property assets.

For our snow assets, the turnover represents revenue earned for the 2021 winter season and Summer 2022. For Bogong, the season was cancelled part way through, however for WF Waters Lodge a partial operation was possible and bookings have been strong for both properties through 2022. Bogong Rover Chalet has incurred two years of significant deficits due to closures, and whilst costs are curtailed where possible, charges including insurance, maintenance and depreciation are unavoidable.

Event operations have returned to normal with surpluses for Surfmoot, Marb and Mudbash reported. RSM in addition has received two \$10k grants for equipment purchases.

Given lockdowns effecting operations in 2021, the results for the financial year ended 30 June 2022 overall are a good outcome for the section. We expect to return to more standard operations in all activities for financial year 2023. The Rover section is also continuing to invest in our facilities with several capital investments underway and the section remains in a sound financial position.



The Consolidated Victorian Rover Council has reported a turnover of \$406,399 for the year ended 30 June 2022 (2021\$160,342), and a net surplus of \$8,480 verses the previous year which reported a deficit of \$69,772.

Turnover was up in excess if 250% as we returned to mostly normal operations after COVID-19 pandemic had severely curtailed our operations in prior year.

Revenue for ski lodges is for the 2021 white season.

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CONSOLIDATED RESULT



- With the exception of Bogong Rover Chalet, all formations in the Victorian Rover Council Group returned a surplus for the year.
- Our activity committees comprising MARB, Mudbash, Surfmoot, Vic Contingent, Rover Scout Motorsport and VRC contributed a combined surplus of \$42,661. This includes \$20,000 in RSM grants and \$1200 in Moot buddies sponsorship. VRC reported a surplus of
- Mafeking reported a surplus of \$3,542, WF Waters Lodge \$5,851 and Bogong Rover Chalet reported a deficit of \$43,574. This deficit is due to significant unavoidable costs and the substantial cancellation of the 2021 winter season. 2022 has been a strong season and FY23 will largely be a return to normal for Bogong.
- The aggregate surplus of \$8.5k is net of \$31k of depreciation and includes \$41k in insurance charges paid to Scouts Victoria.



- The majority of cash balance sits with our properties, however, VRC also retains historical reserves.
- Much of our cash is earmarked for the next phase of development at Mafeking Rover Park which has been endorsed by the VRC.
- Total cash reduced \$46.8k on the previous year, mainly to fund outgoings in the absence of revenue, and capital improvements at Mafeking Rover Park.
- At June, 61.94% (FY21 71.5%) of cash is held in investment deposits predominantly in the Scout Development Fund managed by Scouts Victoria Finance team. The reduction is largely due to a release of cash to fund Bogong operations in the year.

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2022 FINANCIAL SUMMARY Rover Scouts

- The COVID-19 pandemic caused the cancellation of a number of our operations in the 2021 year, however, with the exception of Bogong Rover Chalet, we have returned to more "normal" operations in the 2022 financial year, with Bogong also having a strong operating white season.
- Costs remain restrained as much as possible, but our property assets in
 particular have significant external payments that are unavoidable. In
 particular, the loss in Bogong was partially caused by outgoings such as
 insurance, but also significant consumable purchases for the 2021 winter
 season that was unusable due to the mid season closure of the chalet.



2022 FINANCIAL SUMMARY Scouts

- For the VRC itself, costs in 2022 were able to be contained, the largest cost being our contribution to National Rover Council.
- VRC faced a squeeze between increased NRC costs, and difficulty in collecting this via our traditional appropriation method. Whilst VRC has reserves, annual operating costs need to be met from annual operating income.
- The VRC voted to withhold the final payment to NRC for 2022, and its
 pleasing that some action has been taken on fees, with the 2023 levy
 waived, and the amount per head reduced in subsequent years.
- VRC is now financial with the NRC having paid the latest account.

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2022 FINANCIAL SUMMARY Sco

- I thank and acknowledge the work done by Cameron Phillips our first VRC Finance Officer. With his contribution, the Finance Committee made significant updates to finance policies and templates. This position remains vacant for the ensuring year.
- In previous years, I indicated that the conditions we have were challenging, and this was still the case as we commenced the 2022 year, however as we progressed we were able to run a reasonably normal program, and this has flowed into higher turnover, and a better operating result for the section.
- In addition, we have invested in a number of capital items to take us forward.
- The consolidated VRC remains in a sound position as we progress through financial year 2023.
