4 Office Bearers Reports



4.1 Chair Catherine Marley

Apologies in advance but this is a long one. I promise it's worth it.

We hosted a Rover Specific Youth Mental Health first aid course in December with the assistance of the Branch MHFA Training Team. We had 13 attendees with 11 Rovers and 2 RAs. This was very well received and has added numbers to our welfare team. We are interested in subsidising more MHFA training in the future, but we are unable to secure a dedicated course for Rovers. I will share the training calendar when it is released along with information for how to register for a subsidised place. This will continue our work this year to develop and improve the culture of the rover section.

Apple Isle Moot ran from the 31st of December until the 8th of January. Victoria sent over 140 rovers and a number of RAs along to discover all that Tasmania has to offer. Lily Twyford will likely cover the details in her report, but it was a very successful event. I'd like to congratulate and thank the Victorian Contingent team for getting everyone to Tassie and back smoothly. They put in many long months of work to prepare for the event and in particular I would like to thank Lily for her efforts in making it a successful event for Victoria.

I would also like to congratulate the Tasmanian Moot Operating Committee for pulling this off. Moots are a huge undertaking, especially for one of our smaller branches. The team were able to bring all hands on deck and although we only saw a tiny snapshot of their efforts, they were able to create amazing things.

Changes to Major Events standards has led to a change in moot processes. The next moot will be held in 2027 under the new four year cycle. The new system also requires branches to bid for the opportunity to run a moot. Due to these changes, the next host has not been announced yet. At the National Rover Conference last weekend, Queensland put forward their intention to bid for the next moot. They will also require branch and national approval of this bid to be selected as the next host branch.

Speaking of the NRC Conference, we sent a number of people to attend over the weekend. Myself and Izaak attended as the Chair and Delegate, Pete supported as RA and Lily Stephens and Zac Geddes joined as observers. The observers were selected through an out of session vote by the Executive team due to time sensitivity. The Conference was very productive and collaborative. Izaak will provide a full update, but I want to highlight a couple moments.

Izaak and I facilitated a workshop on supporting Rovers with OAS, where we were able to identify roadblocks and develop solutions. These roadblocks were broken down into Physical, Resources and Framework.

- Physical barriers can be mitigated through Reasonable Adjustments and educating Units on how to manage this fairly.
- Resource barriers can be managed by sharing resources nationally, providing information about funding opportunities, and subsidising interstate courses for specialised skills such as Alpine.
- Framework barriers are being managed in an ongoing review of the achievement pathways, with outcomes including any progressions made within a section after the peak award being carried over to the next section's progressions. This will go a long way to encourage younger sections to achieve their goals and older sections will not be disadvantaged by achieving a lot at a young age.

Another key moment is a motion put forward by Eleanor, the outgoing chair, to waive our 2022 debt and return our voting rights. This was a contentious issue, with a hung vote where Eleanor cast a deciding vote to pass the motion. This is the result of over a year of discussion with NRC during both my term and Kieron's. Additionally, all of the factors in our decision to become non financial have been managed during that time.

• The NRC Levy has lowered from 7.69 in FY22 per rover to 5.43 in FY24. This is due to cuts to the operational



budget.

- The levy has also been waived for FY23 due to the NRC's surplus funds from FY22 that were budgeted to run the conference in person that year.
- We have also seen an increase in value from NRC, with workshops and papers during the conference that dealt with matters that will benefit all rovers.
- The new VRC levy has changed our income model and tie it directly to membership numbers rather than subcommittee income. This has lowered event prices and ensured we can pay upcoming levies regardless of external circumstances. Ideally this will future-proof our income stream and take the pressure off our events and assets.

The NRC has given us an opportunity to build bridges and move on from this issue, so we are going to take it. With a new chair and executive team coming in at the Conference, it is the perfect time for this. We will be paying the FY24 invoice when it comes, and continue to engage with NRC in a way that brings value to Rovers across Australia, rather than just focusing on Victoria.

4.10 NRC Izaak Kitching

Last weekend (20-22 January 2023) was the National Rover Council (NRC) conference. At the start of the first plenary session Eleanor Hewitt (outgoing chair) put forward a motion proposing that NRC would waive Victoria's final instalment of the 2021-2022 payment plan and to allow us to become voting members of the NRC once more. This motion attracted a tied vote. After referring to the NRC By-Laws to confirm the number of votes each branch received, it was deemed that Eleanor had the deciding final vote and so the motion was passed. This means that Victoria is now a financial member of the NRC once more. It is hoped that we can now put everything behind us and looking forward we are very optimistic and hopefully in the future we can share our resources with the other Rover Branches and work together more cooperatively.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome the incoming NRC exec and office bearers for the 2023-24 NRC term.

It was a great weekend, and I would like to thank Bryn Catlin and the NRC team for organizing and running the conference at Bay Park. I went into the weekend with an open mind (I had previously heard mixed reviews about the conference), however I thought it was very well put together. The discussions that were had both during workshops and plenary sessions were very informative and engaging and I personally learnt a great deal. It was also really good to be able to chat to the other branch members outside of the formal proceedings and to hear their views on things. I am going to be honest and say that there appears to be some bad feeling towards Victoria and how we have been perceived by the other branches. These attitudes have impacted on discussions in the past and proven to be very difficult for us around the NRC table. Again we intend to approach this New Year with optimism and hopefully in the future this will be put behind as we build on establishing a more positive relationship. There were a number of papers submitted at the conference, when the minutes from the conference come out I will be sure to get all the documents from the conference out for everyone to look at.

Catherine and I also ran a workshop about supporting Rovers with OAS where we were able to identify roadblocks and develop solutions. These roadblocks were broken down into physical, resources and framework.

The papers submitted at the conference as follows

QLD Rover retention working group - principle:

Queensland put forward a paper to investigate trends in the transition between Venturers and Rovers for 2023 and create a project plan which included a project position description. This paper was passed unanimously.

QLD discussion paper on changing the Baden Powell Award:

Queensland put up a paper to discuss the possibility of changing the name of the Baden Powell award. The NRC exec put forward a motion suggesting that they create a project patrol to look more closely into the name change. Victoria abstained from voting on this motion.

NRC operational plan:

The NRC exec put forward the working action plan for the Strategic Plan for 2022-2026. This was passed unanimously.

Moot Buddies Report:

The NRC exec showed the breakdown of all branches and a breakdown of the moot buddy's budget.

Endorsement of the 2027 national moot host:

Queensland put forward a paper to support their plea to hold the 2027 National Australia Moot. This paper was put forward so that once the National Operation Committee (NOC) have established how the bidding system will work, Queensland will be able to show that they have the support from the other branches in relation to holding the next moot. This passed unanimously.

Rover challenge:

The NRC vice chair put out a paper to show the breakdown of the rover challenge fund. There were only three applications in 2022 and all three were able to gain funding. The NRC exec would like to make this fund more known to Rovers. Any rover is eligible for this funding and it can be used to improve their unit's program and is designed in a way that would challenge the applicant and push their personal boundaries.



NRC By-Laws – restructure and alignment:

At the November NRC remote meeting the exec put forward a proposal to update in line with the national document Hierarchy. This paper passed unanimously.

NRC By-Laws –Workshop proposed changes:

Background:

On the first day of the conference we formed three groups of delegates. Each group consisted of one delegate from each branch and was assigned a task regarding the Bi-Laws that was investigating the current system and recommending changes where appropriate. The groups were assigned to:

Group 1. Looking at the voting structure

Group 2. Looking at meeting procedures

Group 3. Looking at the NRC guidelines

On the Sunday during this session, the NRC table came together to vote on any recommended changes. All recommended changes were passed with some amendments being added to some of the proposed new changes.

Rover Event Management Course 2023:

Thomas Milham, the NRC training and development project officer put forward a paper proposing to offer two participants from each branch (with the possibility for more trainees) to attend this course at their own cost. This paper passed unanimously.

Review and Adjustment of the National Quality Rovering Award:

WA put forward a paper to amend the NRC By-Laws and proposed a design of the award to be taken to the NOC and depending on the decision to manufacture the badge. This paper passed unanimously.

Rover Personal Development course – online running:

WA put up a paper suggesting the running of a personal development course so that members of all rover branches would be able to participate in. This paper passed unanimously.

2022 Financial statements:

The NRC treasurer put up a paper of the 2022 financial statement and this paper was accepted unanimously.

2023-24 draft budgets:

The NRC treasure put up an information paper on the 2023-24 budget to be voted on at the next NRC remote meeting. This will be tabled at the February VRC meeting so that it can be voted on at the March VRC meeting. The biggest change for the 23-24 budget is the reduced rover levy cost of originally being \$7.69 per rover down to \$5.43 per rover.

Formal thank you to the Tasmania Moot committee:

ACT put up a paper thanking the Tasmania Moot committee.

On behalf of Victoria, Catherine, Pete, Lily, Zach and I purchased a bottle of wine for Eleanor along with a card to say thank you for everything she had done over the past two years as well as her contribution on behalf of Victoria last Friday at the conference. None of us were expecting it to happen and for that we are extremely grateful to Eleanor. Prior to the next NRC remote meeting, I would like to run a small workshop with all the region chairs as well as anyone else who is interested in NRC to discuss

Baw Baw Rover Crew for the 2023/24 season. Please note that this budget is submitted for he 2023/24 season to align with the ski season falling in the June-September periods.

Over the past 12 months, the WF Waters Ski Lodge experienced a surplus of \$5.853.35. This is an improvement on the 12 months prior although it was still affected by the lingering impacts of COVID-19, including the majority of winter weekends between July and September 2021.

Items of note over the past 12 months include:

- The refunding of \$39,459 in relation to bookings that were unable to proceed due to the rolling lockdowns throughout the state
- the reduction in the cost of utilities as a result of the lodge remaining empty for the majority of the winter season
- There was a reduction in the site rental for the 2022 ski season, with the expectation that this will
 increase back to the normal rate for the 2023 season.

The upcoming budget currently forecasts a surplus of \$932 for the 2023/24 periods. This is based upon the assumption that we will be fully operational and. This is significantly lower than the forecast for 2022/23 due to the site rental returning to normal levels and a slight reduction in booking income as things normalise again.

Introduction

The Metropolitan Area Rover Ball (MARB) is just one of Victorian Rovers major annual events. Although much smaller than Surfmoot and Mudbash, it tends to attract around 150 to 200 people sometimes including interstate or even international Rovers. Each year has a different theme decided upon by the committee to try and challenge Rover units to come together and be creative to dress up following the theme. In an attempt to make it fair to as much of the state as possible the location of the event also changes from year to year.

This year will be no different with a new and exciting theme already in the works and a new location is being investigated and decided on.

We (the committee) are looking forward to running a great event and hope to see plenty of Rovers attend. We have already started working hard to plan a great night and look forward to seeing the final result.

The recent decline in interest and attendance in the event has put us in a position to need to take action to make the event more financially attractive to younger Rovers with the aim of more attendance this year and into the future.

The MARB Committee seeks the approval of the VRC to use surplus funds in our account to cover the cost of the venue hire. This will allow us to make the event more financially attractive by lowering the ticket cost back to \$65 presale. This will be a direct benefit to all Rovers who attend by making attending MARB more affordable and giving the event a slight boost in funds to run the event with.

This will make the event more likely to run with as many participants as possible and create interest in MARB and Rovering as a whole.

Budget Breakdown

Income:

Ticketing

 Tickets will be returned to \$65 presold should we gain approval to use funds from our surplus to fund the venue hire. This is to gain more interest and attendance from younger Rovers.

- In order to remain conservative the attendance from the past two events has been taken into account. For this reason we are budgeting on the income from only 150 participants.
- This budget allows for leeway if we were to have attendance equal to the 2022 event, and allows for returning some of the surplus funds used.

Bar

- The budget for the bar is not contributing to any profit the event makes. This will ensure bar prices are affordable for all Rovers and offers the lowest possible prices on drinks during the night.
- There is \$12pp income listed, but that zeros out with \$12pp expenditure listed further down.

Expenditure

Venue

- The price of the venue for this year is budgeted to be similar to the venue costs of the past two events. This amount is not included in the budget as we are planning to use surplus funds to pay the venue cost. The budgeted amount is \$2500.
- Security costs have remained the same for the moment and we believe should be more than enough to cover the cost of any security we have to hire for the event. There is an increase in security costs in the scaled summary when 250 participants are achieved because we may require an additional security guard.

Entertainment

- Due to having to budget for lower attendance this year we are budgeting for a less for entertainment. This is most notable in the cost for the talent. We have budgeted for hiring a DJ for the entertainment.

Bar

- As mentioned earlier, drink prices have remained at \$12pp following the same costs allocated to the 2022 event budget. The difference for this year is that we will have to purchase all drinks from retail instead of the previous event.
- Liquor licences vary in price and have been set for the highest price bracket.

Catering

- Catering has been increased by \$200 compared to the previous events budget, and \$2,569.31 compared to the actuals. This is due to MARB 2022 having to scale back catering in response to a low attendance. This includes committee catering. This should ensure that all catering needs can be met and will provide a little more leeway where required. Food shall remain as platters of canapes at this stage.

- Committee catering has been included at \$15 per person. This way the income from committee tickets zeros out and we know where the money is spent along with making sure it doesn't contribute to making the event break even.

The intention for this is to be reinvested back into the event, to make it bigger and better for all participants. The key areas of focus for reinvestment will be the entertainment, decorations/activities, and catering line items; as these are the main areas of value seen by our participants.

KEY POINTS

Due to recent concerns about potential violations of Australian copyright law and Scouts Australia social media policy, it is recommended that future logos and slogans are reviewed prior to publication.

BACKGROUND

- The Surfmoot 2023 logo was met with concerns about copyright violation and associated financial risks. Action was requested from Scouts Victoria and the logo was revised.
- The Mudbash 2023 slogan was met with concerns about Social Media policy violations, and associated reputational risk. Immediate action was requested by Scout Victoria and the slogan was removed until a new slogan could be selected.

ACTION REQUESTED

It is recommended that the Victorian Rover Council:

It is recommended that the Victorian Rover Council add the following to the Subcommittee Policy Book:

'All new logos and slogans must be reviewed by the Chair or Assistant Chair of the VRC prior to use. This is to ensure copyright law and National/Branch Scout Policies are upheld.'
