## **Mentor Training Program Guidelines**

This program is designed to provide a positive and comfortable environment for club members to learn new skills required to obtain CAMS official positions. The mentor program aims to have 2 club members a year complete their various training through this mentor program. The program will allow mentors to provide guidance and knowledge, to pass down to the younger generations of the club. The club member in training may be mentored by any club member who has volunteered to be a mentor for the program and the mentor must have a current cams official license. The mentor must have previously completed two events in this position (in or out of the club) since their cams accreditation.

The club member in training is to attend a club event (this may be a day or weekend) in an observation position if they have previously not shadowed in the assistant position that they are training in. This will allow the mentor to pass on any knowledge to the club member on how traditionally the club may complete particular aspects of these positions or even personal preferences of the mentor. The club member in training will complete all online components as per cams requirements as well any practical requirements. The club member in training is encouraged to complete two events in the assistant position prior to their assessment, we recommend one to be completed in club and the other through another state club, however as to which events and where is up to the individual in training.

Following completion of the online modules, any practical requirements by CAMS and two events in the position the club member in training will be eligible to complete their final practical assessment. The club member in training as the option to request an assessor from CAMS or if available an assessor we have available from the RSM club.

Upon the successful assessment the club member in training will be presented with a club recognition award.
